MUSIC TRIP IN ITALY (SENIOR SCHOOL)

Students will have the opportunity to tour various areas in Italy including Venice, Pisa, Florence, Perugia, San Gimignano, Siena, Assisi and Rome. Special tours will include famous cathedrals such as the Sistine Chapel, museums such as the Vatican Museum and Uffizi Museum, and a tour of the Pompeii Archaeological site and the Roman Colosseum, among many others. Performing in another country, and at other schools, provides an authentic and educational experience for our musicians. There will be at least two performance opportunities (Duomo Square and Perugia Municipal Theatre). The rich culture and history of Italy will foster cross-cultural appreciation and international engagement. Performing and learning about the country's music history will provide enrichment for our music students, activating their prior knowledge and also providing them with new and unique learning experiences. They will return to Ashbury inspired and engaged, ready to take on new challenges, and to give back to their music program as they share what they have learned with their peers as well as younger musicians.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC SERVICE TRIP (JUNIOR SCHOOL)

This service trip open to all students in Grade 7 and 8 with priority given to students in World Issues Club. Grade 7 and 8 students will volunteer in our Sister School, teach games to local children, care for disabled children, work on local projects to improve the quality of life, and play organized sports with local kids.

ROUND SQUARE EXCHANGES (SENIOR SCHOOL)

As a part of our membership with Round Square, Ashbury students are eligible for international student exchanges with any of the Round Square partner schools. Ashbury has arranged exchanges with Daly College in India, St. Stithians College in South Africa, and Woodleigh School in Australia. LONG-TERM EXCHANGE PROGRAMS (SIX TO EIGHT WEEKS)

As part of the importance of bilingualism and learning of French and Spanish languages, we will continue to offer long-term (6 to 8 weeks) exchange programs with <u>École Alsacienne</u> in Paris and <u>Discovery School</u> in Mexico. These exchanges are offered to students in Grades 9, 10 and 11 (non-IB) with at least a 75 % average. Discovery School sends students to Canada in October for six weeks and our students visit Mexico in February and March. École Aslacienne has students interested in spending eight weeks at Ashbury College. Their Grade 9 students can come to Ashbury College either in the fall or spring, and their Grade 10 students can come in May and June. Our students can travel to Paris for eight weeks as of mid-February.

Cost: The cost of the airline ticket and pocket money for your child while in France or Mexico. While hosting, families provide their guest with room, board, lunch and participation in local activities during their stay at Ashbury College.

General Information

We encourage students to apply as soon as possible and contact trip leaders for more information because trips fill up quickly. If the number of students applying for trips exceeds the number of spots available, decisions will be made according to policies. We look to have expressions of interest from students by the end of September 2018.

Our trip leaders are trained by the Canadian International Expeditions Ltd. and are certified by the Royal Geographical Society. We work closely with the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development and Health Canada, and all risk assessments for our trips are in accordance with our risk management policies and protocols.
